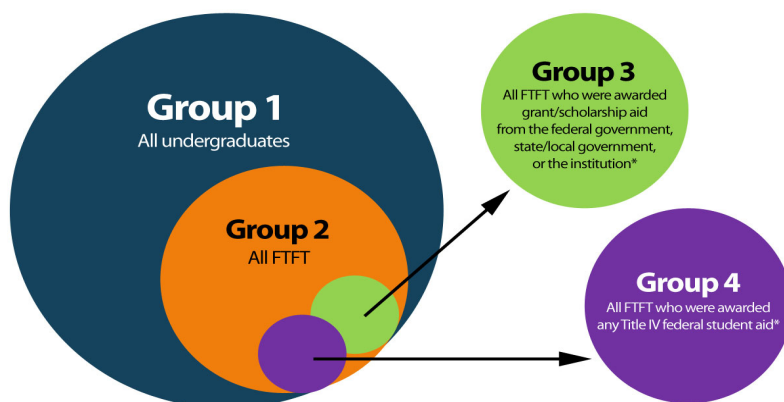
### Overview
