## ST. PETERSBURG COLLEGE

### Overview

Founded in 1927, SPC is Florida's first two-year college and the first to offer bachelor's degrees. SPC offers more than 187 degree and certificate programs, including many high-demand, high-skill industry-recognized workforce certifications. The college's career-focused curriculum is created with input from industry experts to give students the skills they need to meet the needs of today's employers. SPC's Guided Pathways Program gives students a clear roadmap to success to ensure they are taking the right courses in the right sequence, with wrap-around supports to help them achieve their goals. The college's mission is to "empower our students and community to achieve success and economic mobility through academic excellence and engagement."

### Degrees and Programs

St. Petersburg College offers the following academic programs:

- About two dozen **bachelor's degrees** that meet local workforce demands in high-needs areas.
- An **Associate in Arts** degree that emphasizes a liberal arts education and prepares students for a bachelor's degree at SPC or to transfer to a four-year college or university.
- Career and technical education programs (**Associate in Science and Certificates**) that lead to well-paying jobs in Pinellas County or furthering one's career.
