ST. PETERSBURG COLLEGE

Overview

Access and excellence are the hallmarks of St. Petersburg College, which was founded in 1927 as St. Petersburg Junior College, Florida's first two-year institution of higher education. Today, the college stands as a multi-campus, four-year public institution with 10 learning sites throughout Pinellas County, in St. Petersburg, Clearwater, Tarpon Springs, Pinellas Park, Largo and Seminole. SPC serves more than 64,000 students each year and was the first state college in Florida to offer bachelor's degrees. William D. Law Jr. became St. Petersburg College's sixth president in 2010.

2012-13 – A Year of Achievement

- Maria Thurber, a dual-enrolled homeschool student at the St. Petersburg/Gibbs Campus, was named a 2012 Coca-Cola New Century Bronze Scholar. She also received a \$1,000 scholarship from the Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation.
- Tony Smith, Instructor of Speech at the Seminole Campus, was named one of the nation's Best 300 Professors by the *Princeton Review*.
- The Department of Labor announced the awarding of a \$15 million grant to a consortium headed by SPC that aims to allow community colleges and employers to work together to build a statewide training system for advanced manufacturing jobs in high demand.
- The college's My Bridge to Success program was named a winner of the 2012 Chancellor's Best Practice Award by the Florida Department of Education. The program in developmental writing, reading and mathematics courses helps to reduce the amount of remediation time and tuition costs for students.
- A new firefighter internship program was created in collaboration with Largo, Palm Harbor, Pinellas Park and St. Petersburg fire departments. The first of its kind in Florida, the program provides Fire Academy graduates with 200 hours of additional classroom and practical experience.
- For an eighth consecutive year, St. Petersburg Collegiate High School at the St. Petersburg/Gibbs Campus has received an "A" rating from the state of Florida. It is ranked among the best high schools in the state and is No. 1 in Pinellas County. In addition, SPCHS received Best High Schools, Bronze Award by U.S. News & World Report.
- On Oct. 22, students launched MYRA (Make Your Radio Active), the college's first student-run online radio station.
- Brad Jenkins, Program Director of Engineering Technology, was named the 2012 Educator of the Year by the National High Impact Technology Exchange Council. He developed Florida's first Associate in Science degree in engineering technology, which has been adopted by 10 other colleges throughout the state.
- In August, the Collaborative Center for Emerging Technologies opened at the Clearwater Campus. As a leader in workforce education, CCET will train tomorrow's engineering technology and manufacturing workers.
- The college moved into the top 20 list for veteran-friendly colleges in the nation, according to the 2012 ranking by the *Military Times* and *Edge Magazine* publications. The college was ranked 15th "most veteran friendly" among four-year colleges nationally based on a survey that looked at factors such as enrollment, academic support, veterans' staff and the college's per-credit-hour rate. In 2011, SPC placed 47th, the first time the college had received a ranking in the survey.
- The construction for the Douglas L. Jamerson Jr. Midtown Center, the 49,000-square-foot learning facility at St. Petersburg College, is underway at the corner of 22nd Street South and 13th Avenue South in St. Petersburg. The building is scheduled to open in mid-2015.
- Bill McCloud, a Gibbs Junior College alumnus and member of the SPC Foundation Board of Directors, received the 2012 Council for Resource Development Benefactor Award. McCloud is a scholarship donor at the college and an active participant in initiatives impacting student success. He was honored for his philanthropy, leadership and volunteerism.
- More than 11,000 students, staff and others attended a visit by President Barack Obama at the Seminole Campus on Sept. 8. His visit marked the first by a sitting president.
- SPC is recognized for its Veterans Services program as Best for Vets Colleges by the *Military Times* and a Top Military-Friendly College by the *Military Advanced Education Magazine*.
